











## NDCs, the Paris Agreement and the Sustainable Development Goals: Tracking progress and finding synergies

This side-event presents the collaborative work of more than 20 national institutions from various countries worldwide on the latest quantitative assessments of projected GHG emissions pathways and key energy indicators for major emitting countries. These policy scenarios are put in the context of the implementation of NDCs and development of long-term, low-emission strategies, and compared with various below 2°C and 1.5°C scenarios at the country-level. Moreover, we present national policies to ratchet up climate ambitions consistent with the Paris climate targets and the resulting long-term, low-emission pathways and show how mitigation interacts with the SDGs.
