

## Enrique Cabrero Mendoza, Director General, CONACYT

Dr. Enrique Cabrero Mendoza completed a degree in Administration at the Autonomous University of San Luis Potosí, Mexico (1977); He obtained a Master's Degree in Public Administration from the Center for Economic Research and Teaching -CIDE- A.C., Mexico (1980); the Pedagogical Improvement Program by the Center d'Enseignement Supérieur des Affaires, CESA, France, (1982); and the Doctorate in Management Sciences from the H.E.C School, France; (2001).

He has been a visiting professor at: Ecole Normale Supérieure de Cachan, in France; at the University of Birmingham in Great Britain; and at the Autonomous University of Barcelona in Spain, among others. In addition, he is a member of the National System of Researchers of the National Council of Science and Technology (CONACYT), Level III. He has been a professor-researcher of the Public Administration Division of the Economic Research and Teaching Center, A.C. (CIDE) since 1982, director of this Division, and director of said Center from 2004 to 2012.

He is founder of the journal Gestión y Política Pública del CIDE, which is part of the scientific journals of the Conacyt registry. Founder of the Government and Local Management Award that the CIDE carries out annually since 2000. Author and editor of twenty books and more than a hundred articles and book chapters in Mexico and several countries such as the United States, France, Spain, Great Britain, Canada, Brazil, Argentina and Chile, on issues of decentralization, public policies, local governments, cities, competitiveness, and science and technology policies. Among his most recent publications are "Mexican Cities. Challenges in concert? "(FCE)," Competitiveness of Cities in Mexico, the new urban agenda "(CIDE-SE)," Federalism in the United Mexican States "(To understand)," Public action and local development " (FCE), and "The institutional design of science and technology policy in Mexico" (UNAM-CIDE).

He has been distinguished as Caballero in the order of the Academic Palms by the Ministry of National Education of France; as a member of the National System of Researchers since 1987; as a member of the Mexican Academy of Sciences; as a member of the National Council of ANUIES representing the Public Research Centers of the country; as a counselor of the Mexican Institute for Competitiveness IMCO, as a member of the Board of Directors of: Woodrow Wilson Center of Washington, COLEF, CIESAS, INEE, CIMAT; as a member of the Editorial Board of International Management Review, Public Organization Review, Management and Public Policy, North America Magazine, Iberoamerican Magazine of Municipal Studies, among others; as a grantee of various foundations and international organizations such as Ford Foundation, CIDOB, World Bank, IDB, UNDP, CNRS, ILO, CLAD, among others; founding member of the Public Policy Academy and the Network of Local Government Researchers; and named member of the 300 leaders of Mexico.

He has also been a consultant to various international institutions such as OECD, UNDP, DEXIA, World Bank; and national as Secretary of Economy, Sedesol, INEGI, Cofemer and SARH, among others.
