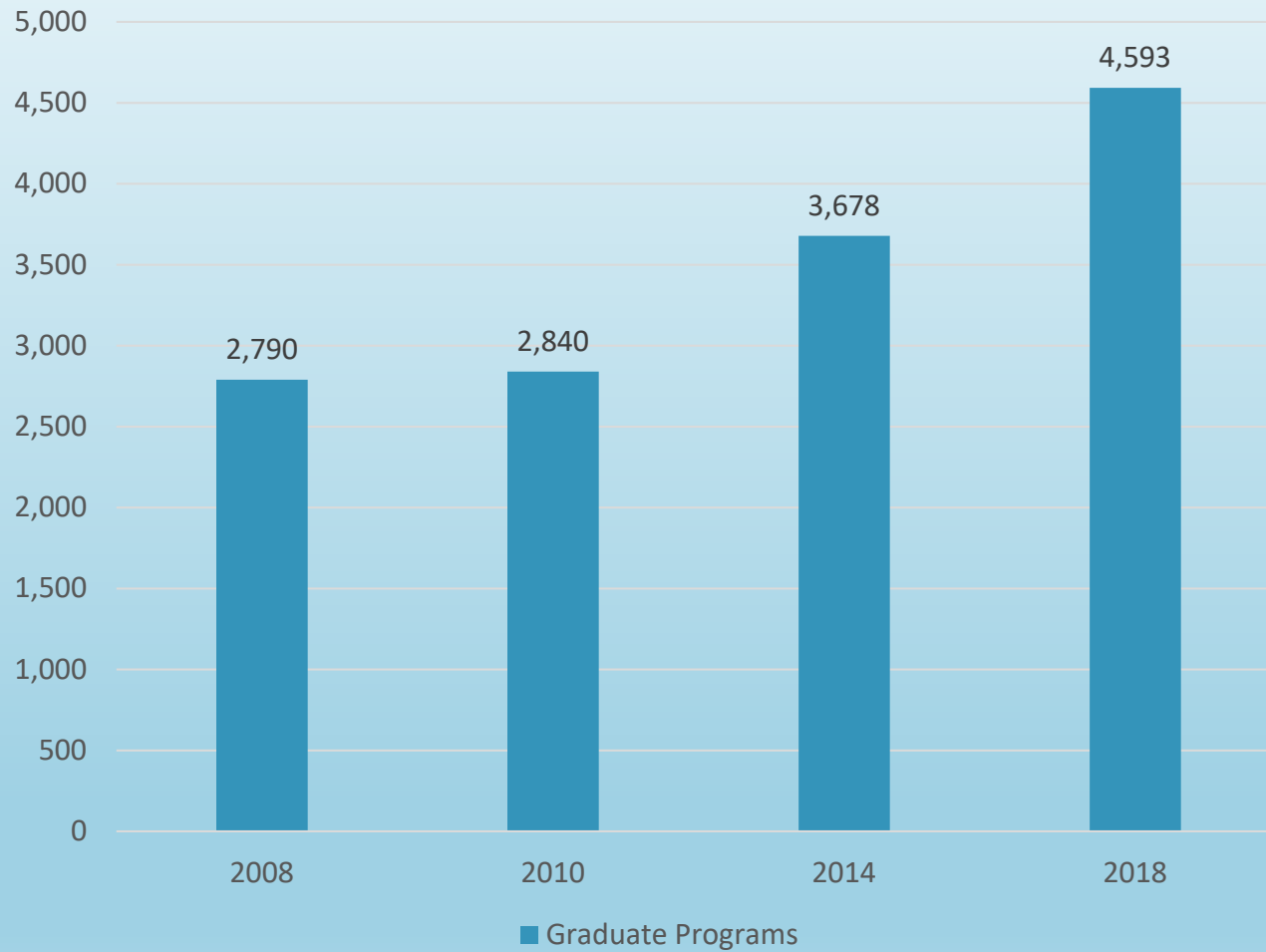

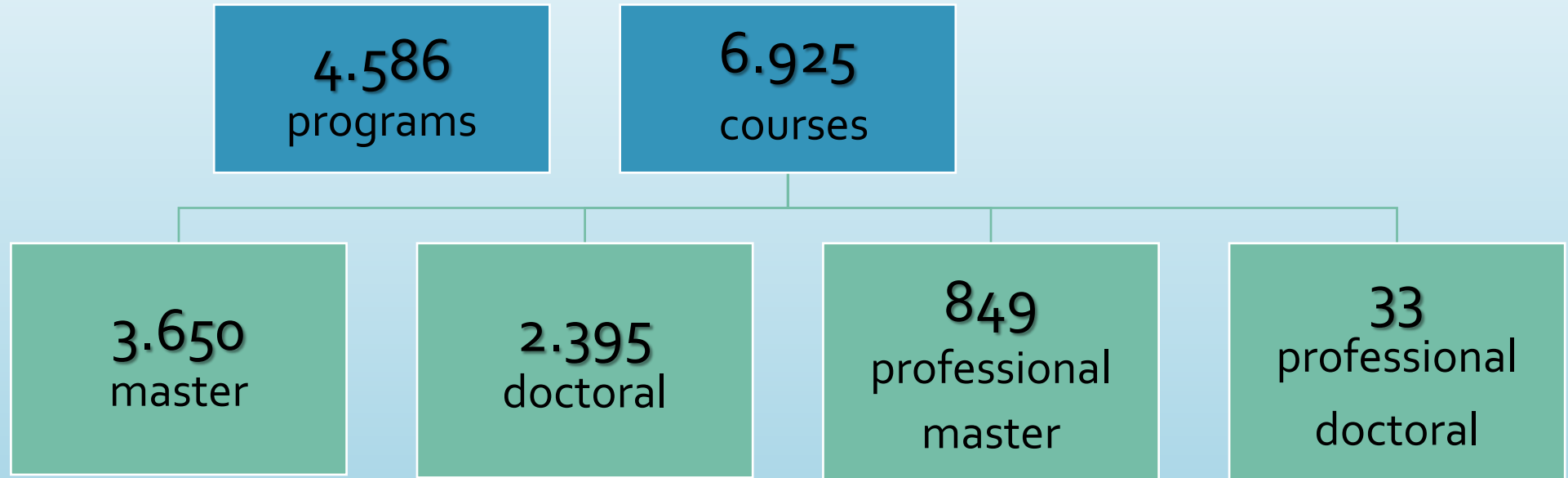

THE NATIONAL GRADUATE SYSTEM (SNPG) 2019



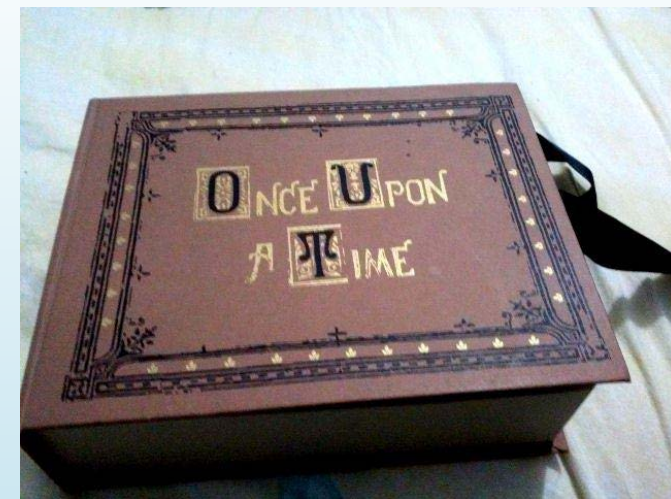

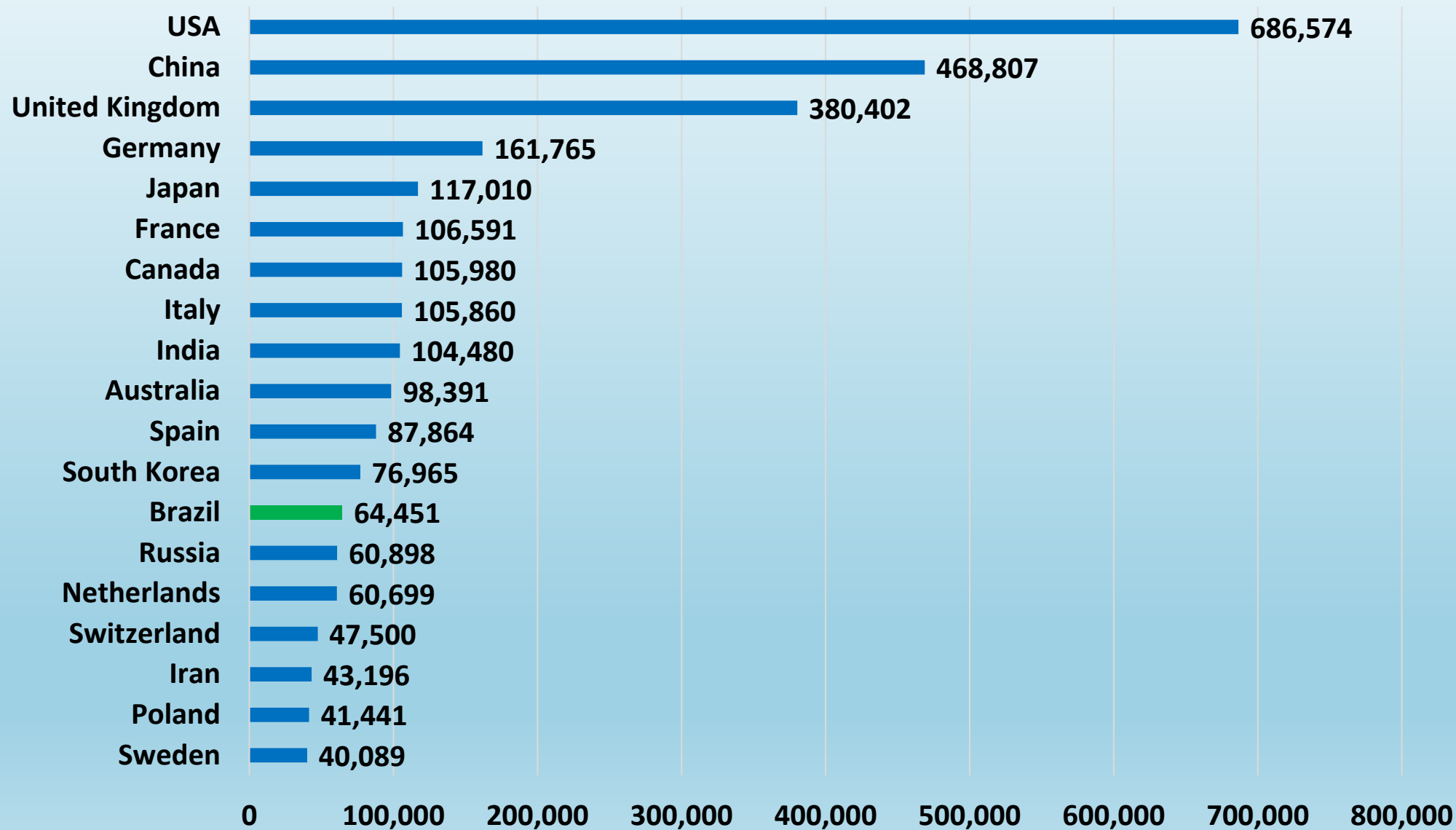

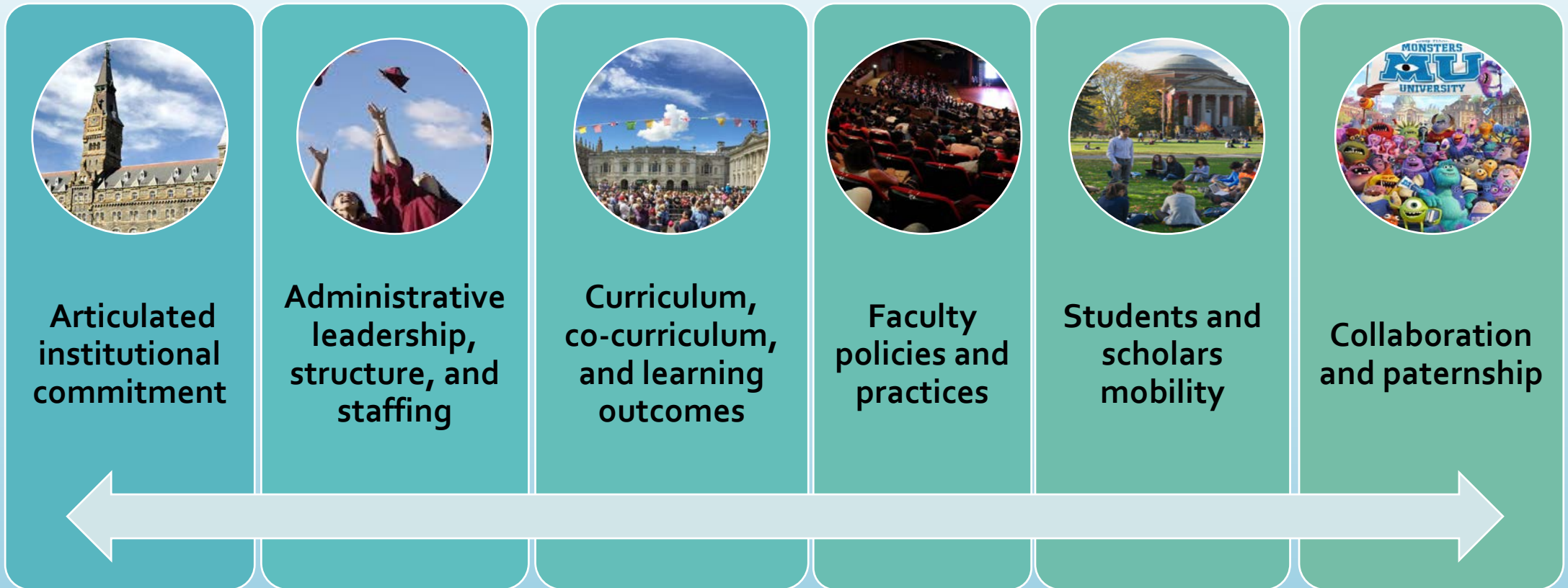
SCIENTIFIC PRODUCTION

University project, not an action of isolated groups!



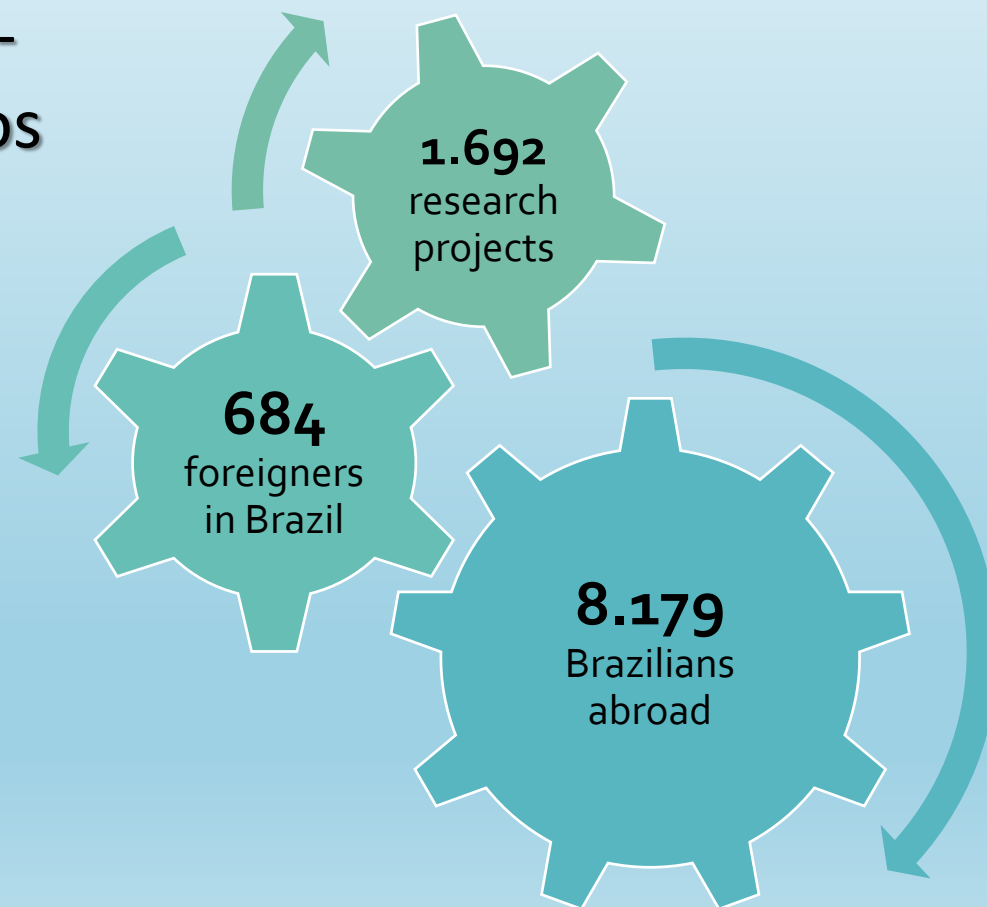
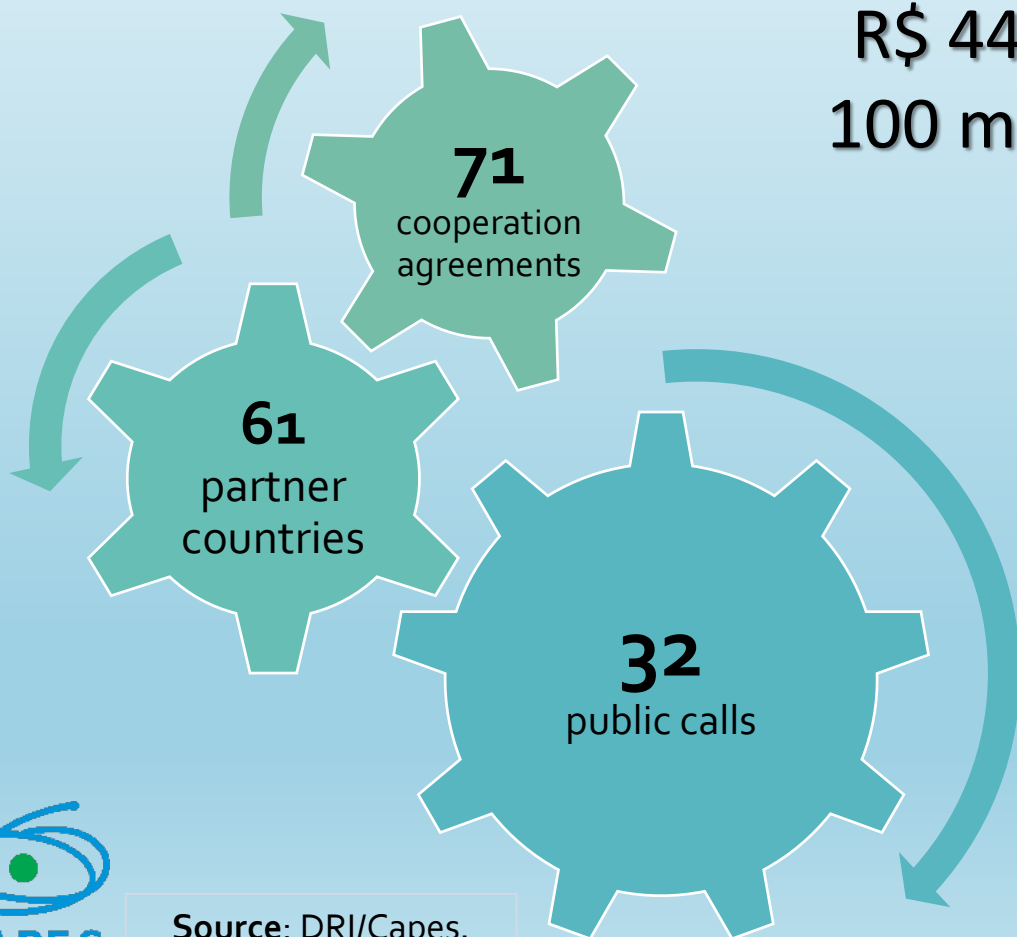

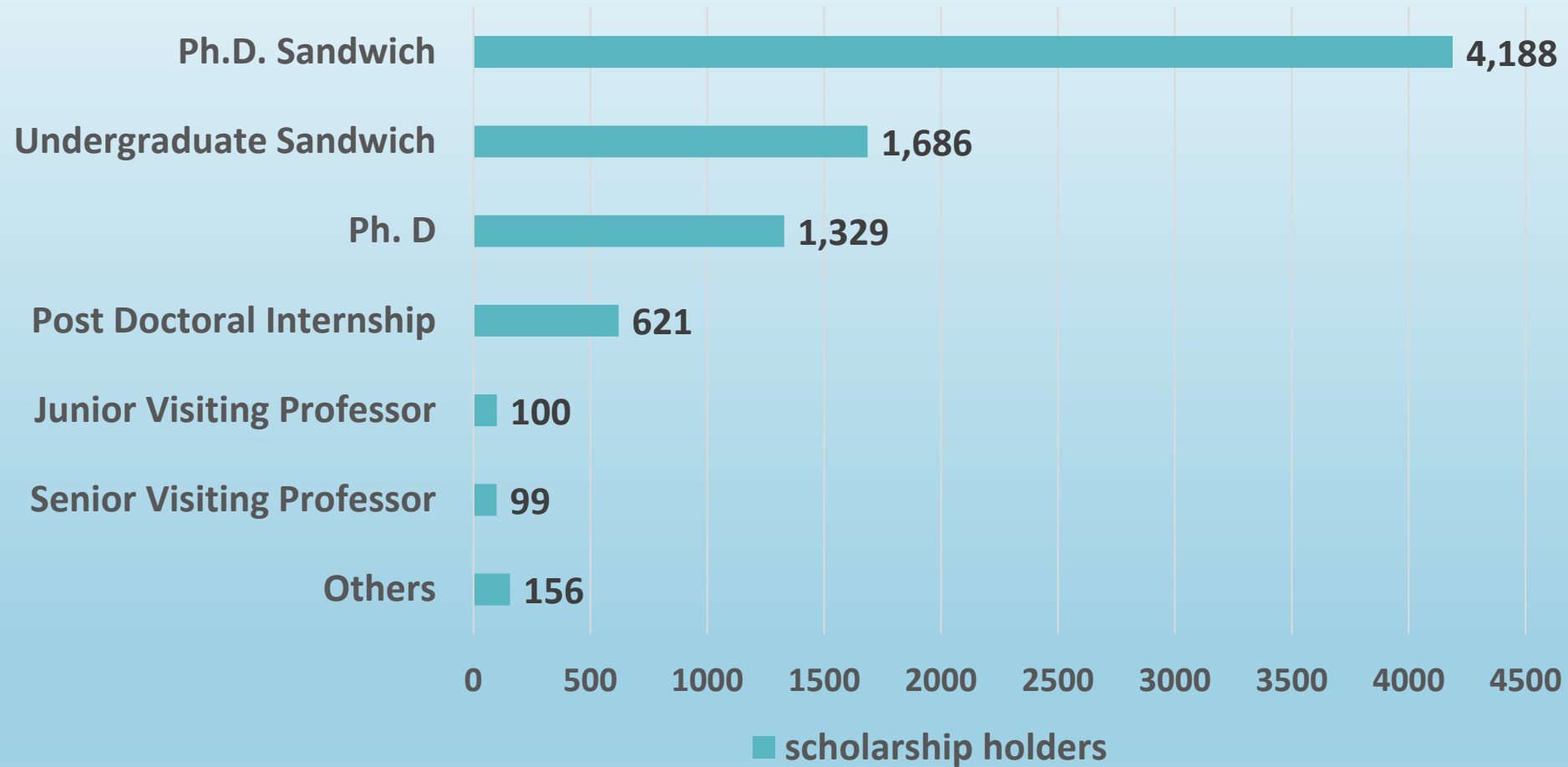

Capes: perspectives for internationalization for 2019

Institutional Program of Internationalization - PrInt

- Launched in 2017 through the Edital (call) 41/2017.
- The 36 approved HEIs began project implementation in November 2018 with a 5-year term (2019-2023).
- There are 565 projects planned with 197 strategic themes for activities in 86 partner countries.



The Capes-Print Program aims to:



fostering **strategic** internationalization **plans**.



participation of Brazilian institutions in international **research networks**.



transformation of participating institutions into an **international environment**.



integration of other Capes promotion actions to the internationalization effort.

Internationalization Lab

- Support to the internationalization process of Brazilian HEIs
- 3 HEI Pilot: UFPA, UFG and UEM
- Criteria for Pilot Project participation:
 - registration in the PrInt Call
 - highest percentage of PPGs with 5,6 or 7 concepts
- 3 workshops held in 2020
- 18 months long
- Capacity building

International Doctorate

- Project submission by existing PPGs in SNPG
- Development of activities in the involved HEIs (Brazilian and foreign)
- Double degree/diploma
- Foreign Language Classes
- Co-Curriculum

Reintegration of researchers with a PhD degree

Humboldt Pilot Project

- Former Postdoc Fellow in Germany
- Postdoc Grant Guarantee in Brazil
- Humboldt will complement monthly scholarship with € 500.00
- Humboldt will grant € 20,000 grant to the researcher project

Negotiation with other international funding agencies

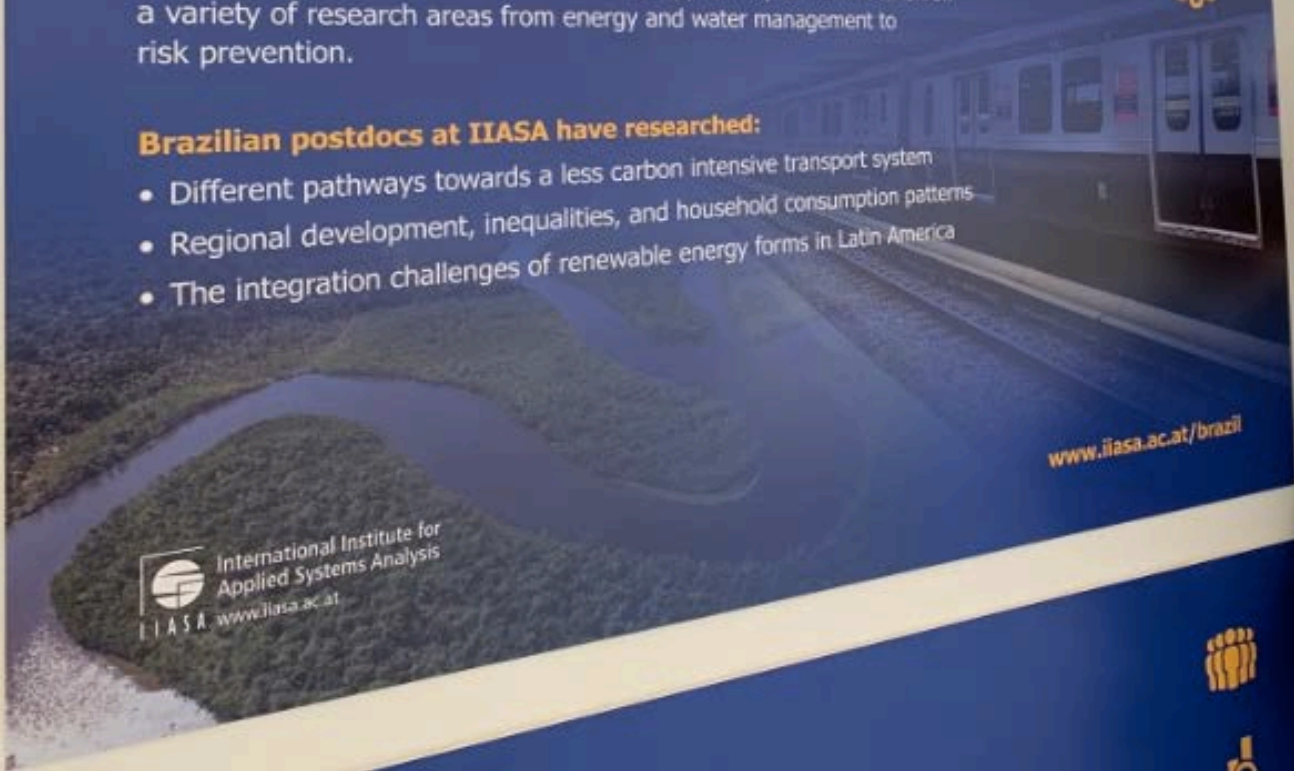

Brazilian postdocs at IIASA have researched:

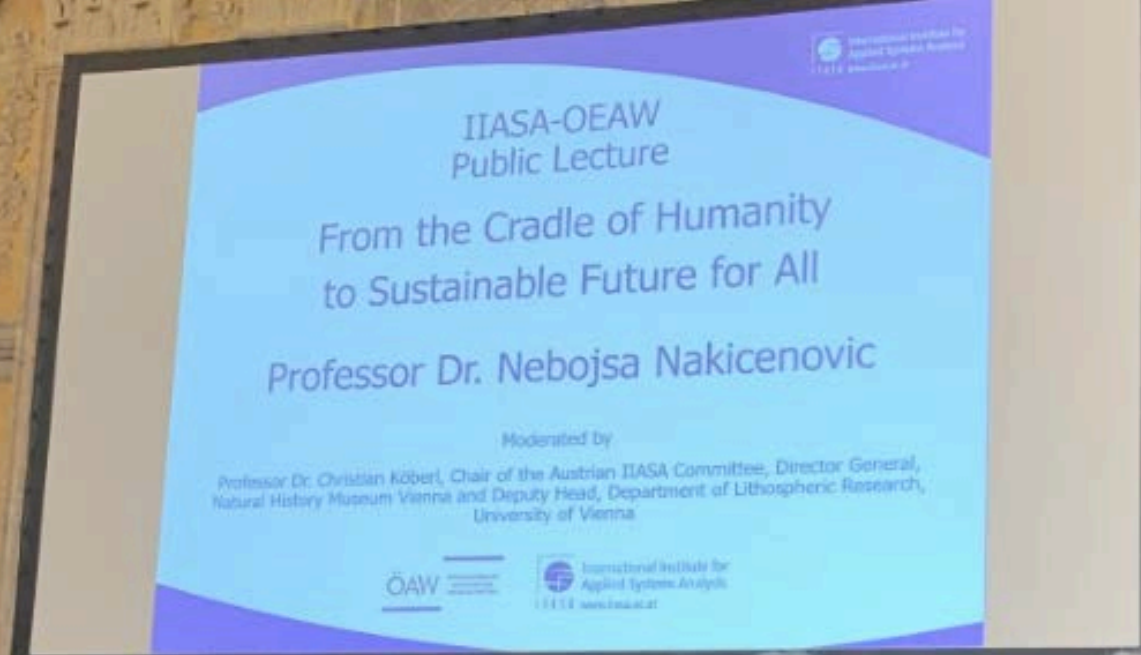
- Different pathways towards a less carbon intensive transport system

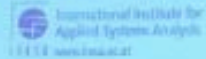
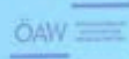
